M.A. PSYCHOLOGY: LIFESPAN COUNSELLING

Course Structure AS PER NEP 2020

The M.A. Psychology: Lifespan Counselling programme is a full-time degree programme consisting of four semesters over two years.

The course consists of 88 credits. Each theory credit equals 15 hours. Each practicum credit equals 30 hours. The credit distribution across the course is as follows:

- Semester-wise: 22 credits (Sem I) + 22 credits (Sem II) + 22 credits (Sem III) + 22 credits (Sem IV)
- Theory, Practicum and Fieldwork: 59 credits (Theory) + 12 credits (Fieldwork) + 10 credits (Research) + 7 credits (Practicum)

Frequently Asked Questions

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR THE COURSE ?

Candidates must have a Bachelor's degree in any faculty or discipline having studied a **minimum of three papers in Psychology** at the undergraduate level (across three years). **Diplomas/certificate/online courses** in Psychology **DO NOT** fulfill the eligibility criterion.

WHEN DOES THE ADMISSION PROCESS BEGIN ?

The admissions notice and relevant forms will appear on the college website in the month of April/May. An **entrance examination** will be conducted in the month of June.

Please note: If you are an **NRI candidate**, there will be a variation in the admission procedure. Please contact the University of Mumbai, as well as <u>xav.mapsych@gmail.com</u> to obtain further information regarding the same.

WHAT DOES THE ADMISSION PROCESS INVOLVE ?

An **entrance examination** will be conducted in the month of June.

- Section I is a **multiple choice test** (100 questions), based on the University of Mumbai Undergraduate Psychology syllabus.
- Section II is an **essay question** which will only be assessed on obtaining a passing grade in Section I.
- The merit list will be based on the entrance test score (70% weightage) and the Undergraduate Semester V marks (30% weightage).

Please note: The Entrance Examination is conducted OFFLINE at the St. Xavier's College, Fort, Mumbai campus only ONCE A YEAR in JUNE . Multiple examinations or Online entrance examinations will not be conducted.

IS AN INTERVIEW A PART OF THE ADMISSIONS PROCESS?

A **pre-admission interview** is conducted with students whose names appear on the merit list. The purpose of the interview is **solely to orient the student to the course** and help students make a decision as to whether they wish to commit to the programme. This is **NOT a selection interview**.

WHAT IS THE INTAKE FOR THE COURSE ?

30 students are accepted to the course each academic year.

WHAT ARE THE COURSE FEES?

The fees for **MA I for 2024-25** would be **Rs. 1,50,000.** However, these fees are subject to revision. Please refer to the college website for further details.
