Instructions for XET 2022 General Instructions

- Please reach the Venue for the XET 2022 at least an Hour prior to the commencement of your entrance test.
- Candidates are advised to carry **only** the following items with them into the examination venue:
 - Print out of the Admit Card emailed to the registered candidates by St. Xavier's College, Mumbai.
 - Signature of the candidate on the Admit card must be done in Presence of the Invigilator/Supervisor at the Centre and not prior.
 - Photo Identity Proof (Aadhar Card /Passport /PAN card /Driving License) in Original.
 - A transparent Ball Point Pen (Black or Blue)
 - Personal hand sanitizer (50 ml)
 - Personal transparent water bottle if required (No steel bottles allowed)
 - Any type of electronic device is not allowed, including smart watches, mobile phones, laptops, tablets, headphones etc.
- Unfair means of any kind noticed and reported by the supervisors at the centre will be dealt with according to the University Guidelines for such malpractices. Candidates found guilty of such malpractice will be disqualified from the admission process.

Instruction regarding Question Paper & Marking scheme

- There are two sections in the question paper. Both sections are compulsory.
- A separate answer sheet will be provided. This sheet will contain a grid for the answers to Section I, and a ruled sheet for the answer to Section II. Please note down your answers on your answer sheet. No answers are to be marked on the question paper itself. Nothing marked or written on the question paper will be evaluated.
- Please note down answers to both sections in pen. Nothing written in pencil will be evaluated.
- Section I consists of 100 multiple choice questions. Each question is for 1 mark. There is no negative marking.
- Section II consists of an essay question. This question is for 20 marks 10 marks for the content of your answer and 10 marks for the coherence of your writing.
- Thus, the total marks for the paper is 100 marks (Section I) + 20 marks (Section II) = 120 marks in all.
- The duration of the examination is 2 hours (120 minutes).
- Students with learning disabilities can avail of a provision of extra time for this, the department needs to be informed in advance and the student should carry the certificate and show it to the supervisor in the examination room.
