

The growing environment degradation problem and the insensitive people towards causing pollution led us to conduct a workshop on waste management. Waste needs to be managed because it is one of the root causes of all major pollutions like air, water and land. In spite of this, very few of us are actually aware about the right way to manage different categories of waste. The workshop tried to impart the best possible methods of waste management through enabling students to debate on the different viewpoints they held on the situations posed by the resource person.

Students were also introduced to an invention of the organisation that helps decompose waste at home and does not require an open pit for the same. Finally, at the end students were asked to submit the dry waste they had collected from their locality and college for safe disposal. The methods and processes of the same were explained and further, the organisation took the waste for safely disposing it.



#### <u>RESUME WRITING WORKSHOP</u> DATE: <u>8 AUGUST, 2019</u> ECC POINTS: <u>3</u> RESOURCE INSITUTION: <u>THE RED PEN</u>

This workshop was organised keeping in mind the need of the students to know the right way of making resumes. While the TYs were ready to present themselves before recruiters, the FYs and SYs are often in a state of confusion about the universally accepted pattern of designing a resume. Therefore, the workshop conducted by The Red Pen discussed and cleared doubts on every little detail about a resume.

For this, the team had brought handouts of sample resumes and students were asked to rate the resumes (assuming they were recruiters), make corrections and note down the essentials. This activity provided a practical guidance on how a resume should be made and therefore, the workshop was not a mere lecture. Further, students were also given the opportunity to discuss the drawbacks/corrections (if any) in their own resumes personally with the resource team.

#### DISCOVERY OF CORE COMPETENCE DATE: <u>20 JULY, 2019</u> ECC POINTS: <u>2</u> RESOURCE PERSON: <u>AMRUT BANG FROM NIRMAN</u>

The workshop was conducted by NIRMAN Youth Leadership Development Program which aims to facilitate the search of purpose among young adults and nurture them as active contributors for social change.

The aim of the workshop was to inculcate habits and ideas of social change through enabling one to discover their core competence. The resource person conducted activities wherein he divided students into different groups, gave them situations related to current happenings and discussed the behaviour that students might adopt. The different approaches of students lead him to explain the importance of knowing one's core capacities, which are often shaped through observing how others behave, but do not collude to one's own personality traits. Often students are confused or choose the wrong path while making career decisions. The workshop through different video clippings tried to solve certain problems that students raised to the resource person.

# Antarchakshu<sup>®</sup>2.0 (Season 2) – The Eye Within Experience the Unexplored World

Antarchakshu<sup>®</sup>2.0 — The Eye Within, conceptualised by the XRCVC, is a simulation workshop aimed at creating a sneak preview for the sighted into the world of the visually challenged.

Season 2 of Antarchakshu<sup>®</sup>2.0, launched on September 20 2019, was supported by State Bank of India (SBI) as the main sponsor. The other sponsors were SBI Foundation, Dhun Pestonji Parakh Discretionary Trust, Godrej Industries Limited, Techmahindra Foundation, Union Bank of India, SBI Mutual Fund, Hindustan Unilever Ltd, Tata Sons Private Limited, and Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL).

In all, 53 workshops were conducted, which reached out to 1706 participants. The concluding workshop was held on February 24, 2020.

The wide spectrum of groups targeted during Season 2 of Antarchakshu<sup>®</sup>2.0 included students of social work, management, design, fashion, arts, science, commerce, information technology, as well as corporate employees, eye hospital staff, university staff, Lion's Club members, and Jesuit Juniors, among others.

Participants, through experiencing a disability simulation, learned to reflect on personal attitudes towards people with vision impairment.


This simulation was then followed by an interactive session. The objective of the module was to equip participants with an insight, understanding and basic facts about the lives of the visually impaired, the 'How?' of their lives — as also to foster an insight in developing their own personal perspective on the issue. The key approach during the workshop was to create a simulated experiential environment of blindness wherein participants had to undertake various activities.

This experience formed the basis for further reflection and discussion around the focus areas — be they diversity in inclusion, accessibility or at the workplace.

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
